



Reminder: Novus Ordo & non-practicing Catholics cannot serve as godparents, since they lack the intention of seeing to the traditional Catholic upbringing of children. Baptisms should take place within a month after birth. A grave reason is needed to delay it beyond then.

**MATRIMONY:** For practicing traditional Catholics only. Contact the priest at least 6 months before the wedding date for marriage instructions. The best man and maid of honor of the marriage should be Catholics, since they are the official witnesses to the Sacrament of Matrimony.

**HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK:** Please contact and arrange with Father if a sick call is needed. If anyone is in danger of death, please call Father **IMMEDIATELY!** for **Extreme Unction or Last Rites.**

**CONFIRMATION:** Will be conferred by Bishop Pivarunas upon request. Please let Father know of the need for youth or adults who may need, so as to begin preparation and to put in a request for a visit by Bishop Pivarunas.

**HOLY ORDERS:** Please see Father if a man feels a calling towards the priesthood and would like information or a woman feels called to the religious life.

## DRESS CODE FOR CMRI CHAPELS

**Out of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, and in keeping with Christian modesty, please observe the following standards of dress:**

**Women and girls**—A suitable hat or veil should be used, that covers at least the crown of the head (I Cor. 11:5, 6, 10). No slacks, no sleeveless, revealing, or low-cut clothing (the Marylike Crusade's standard is that a dress be not cut more than two fingers' width below pit of throat). Dresses & skirts should cover knees when you are standing or sitting, and not have long slits in them. Strapless or spaghetti-strap clothing is always sinfully immodest and should never be worn. Please avoid "straight skirts" as well, since they are usually form-fitting and tight.

**Men and boys**—Suit coat and tie, dress slacks, or other formal attire. Jeans, shorts, "flip-flops," and other casual attire are inappropriate for church! Be sure to also avoid clothing with logos and/or large lettering, as these can be quite distracting. We welcome all our guests and visitors, and encourage you to read the blue pamphlet "Welcome to the Traditional Latin Mass" (available in the vestibule). It explains why we must completely avoid the modern Mass and liturgies introduced since Vatican II.

## **The Way of Salvation (St. Alphonsus de Liguori)** **Resurrection of the Body**

A day will come which will be the last of days, when this world will be no more. Before the coming of the Judge, fire will descend from heaven, and consume everything that is upon the earth: *The earth and the works which are in it will be burned up.* – 2 Peter 3, 10. So that in that day everything upon the earth will be reduced to ashes. O God! What will all the vanities of this world then appear, for which so many now sacrifice the salvation of their souls? What appearance will all the highest dignities of this earth then make – its purple, its

crowns, and its scepters? O the folly of those who shall have loved them! And O the lamentations of those who for the love of such vanities shall have lost their God!

*The trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall rise incorruptible.* – 1 Cor. 15, 52. This trumpet will call all men together from their graves to come to judgment. Oh how beautiful and resplendent will the bodies of the just appear! *Then the just will shine like the sun.* – Matt. 13, 43. On the contrary, how ugly and deformed will the bodies of the reprobate appear! What a torment will it be to those wretched souls to be again united with their bodies, for whose gratification they have lost heaven and lost their God, to be cast with them forever into hell, there to burn together in eternal flames! Happy will they then be who have denied their bodies all gratifications displeasing to God; and who, in order to hold them in greater subjection, have mortified them by fasting and penance!

O Jesus! *Hide not Thy face away from me*, as I have deserved. – Ps. 142, 7. How often, for the sake of gratifying my senses, have I renounced Thy friendship! Oh that I had died rather than have thus dishonored Thee! Have pity on me.

All mankind being assembled together, will be summoned by angels to appear in the valley of Josaphat, there to be publicly judged before all: *Nations, nations in the valley of destruction.* – Joel 3, 14. O my God! And must I appear in that valley? In what place shall I stand there – with the elect in glory, or with the reprobate in chains? My beloved Redeemer, Thy precious blood is my only hope. Woe to me! How often have I deserved to be condemned to dwell forever in hell, far, far from Thee, without being able to love Thee! No, my Jesus, I will love Thee forever, in this life and in the next. Permit me not to be ever again separated from Thee by sin.
